Jesus Journey through Holy Week

Palm Sunday

• Jesus' triumphal entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem begins his final week. [Matthew 21:1-11; Mark 11: 1-11; Luke 19:28-38' John 12:12-19]

Monday of Holy Week

- Jesus overturned the tables of the money changers in the temple. [Matthew 21: 12-17, Mark 11: 15-19, Luke 19: 45-48]
- Jesus teaches the people (We are not told which day(s) this happened on.) [John 19: 20-50]

Tuesday of Holy Week

- Back in Jerusalem, Jesus was confronted by the Temple leadership for what He had done the previous day; they questioned His authority. He also taught extensively using parables and other forms: [Matthew 21: 18 – 23:39 Mark 11:12 – 12:44 Luke 20 -21:4]
 - The withered fig tree [Matthew 21:18-22 and 24: 32-35, Mark 11: 12-26.]
 - Parable of the fig tree [Luke 21:29-33]
 - The parable of the vineyard [Matthew 21:33-46 Mark 12: 1-12. Luke 20: 9-18];
 - the parable of the wedding banquet [Matthew. 22:1-14];
 - the teaching on paying taxes]Matthew 22:15-22, Mark 12: 13-17, Luke 20: 19-26]
 - Rebuke of the Sadducees who denied the resurrection [Matthew. 22:23-33, Mark 12: 18-27, Luke 20: 27-40].
 - The great commandment and teaching about the Messiah [Matthew: 34-46, Mark 12:28-37, Luke 20: 41-47]
 - The widow's offering [Mark 12: 41-44, Luke 21: 1-4]
 - Prophecy about the destruction of Jerusalem [Matthew 24; Mark 13; Luke 10: 25-28 and 19:41-44 and 21:5 -37]
 - Parable of the 10 Bridesmaids [Matthew 25: 1-13
 - Parable of the 3 servants [Matthew 25: 14-30
 - Parable of separating the sheep and the goats: in as much as you did (or didn't) feed or visit others, you did (or didn't) feed Jesus. [Matthew 25: 31-46]

Wednesday of Holy Week

- Judas conspires with the chief priests to hand Jesus over. [Mt. 26:1-5, Mark 14: 1-2 and 10-11. Luke 22: 1-6].
- In the evening, Mary of Bethany anointed Jesus with costly perfumed oil. [Matthew 26:6-16; Mark 14: 3-11; (Luke has a similar story of Jesus' anointing earlier in 7:36-50)

Holy Thursday.

- Jesus' disciples prepare for the evening meal. Passover would start at sunset. [Matthew 26:17-19, Mark 14:12-16, Luke 22:7-13].
- The Last Supper, Matthew, Mark and Luke version: Passover meal when Jesus shared bread and wine and instituted the Eucharist [Matthew 26:20-35; Mark 14:17-31; Luke 22:14-38]
- The Last Supper, John version: evening before the Passover. Jesus washed his disciples' feet and then gave a long talk to his disciples and prayed for them. [John 13 17]
- Jesus' prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane, and his arrest by the religious leaders and taken to the High Priest's house. [Matthew 26:17-35; Mark 14:32-52 Luke 22:39-53; John 18: 1-14]
- Peter denies knowing Jesus [Matthew 26:17-35; Mark 14: 66-72- Luke 22:39-53; John 18: 1-14]

Good Friday

- Death of Judas [Matthew 27: 1-10]
- Jesus' trial: [Matthew 27:11-31, Mark 15: 1-20, Luke 23: 1-25, John 18:10-19:16]
- Jesus' crucifixion and death: Matthew 27:32-56, Mark 15: 22-40, Luke 23:26-49, John 19:16-37]
- Jesus' burial: Matthew 27:57-66, Mark 15: 42-47, Luke 23:50-56, John 19: 38-42]

Holy Saturday

- The Sabbath; nothing is recorded for this day of rest
- Tradition says he had "descended into hell" where he rescued the souls of the dead

Easter Day

- The Empty tomb [Matthew 28: 1-15; Mark 1+:1-8; Luke 24: 1-12; John 20: 1-18]
- The Road to Emmaus Luke 24:
- Jesus appears to his disciples [John 20: 19-23]
